One curious characteristic of some left-handed writers is their ability to produce mirror writing, sometimes quite spontaneously.

Mirror writing is that form of script which appears normal when it is reflected in a mirror. Evidence suggests that children are more likely to produce mirror writing than adults.

Lewis Carroll, an Oxford maths don and creator of Alice in Wonderland, wrote mirror script letters to his young friends, and Leonardo da Vinci, whose genius needs no elaboration, kept his notebooks in mirror writing because he found it relaxing after a hard day in the studio!
